DUTY OF CARE

Dear Parents,

We are always concerned about the safety of the children therefore we would like to make the following requests.

For **all** of our safety and security we request you to personally deliver and pick up your child to the Scout hall everytime. If for any reason you are unable to do that please make arrangements with another parent to do so for you.

There will be **NO** sign in/out register to do so.

As parents we are all aware that children **move** very quickly and often place themselves just where we want to drive. Can we request you to make sure that when you park your car at the top before you come down or are leaving that you **drive carefully**.

UNIFORM

Request

UNIFORM - The Scout uniform must be worn with pride. The new uniform includes – the navy cub shirt, for the trousers they can be light-coloured shorts/trousers (light colour is beige/stonewash/light brown).

SHOES – (I quote this from the leaders hand book)

All cubs and leaders may not own a pair of leather shoes or boots. Sneakers are often an option worn by cubs and leaders – **HOWEVER THESE MUST BE BLACK ONLY!**

Boots or sneakers they still need a brush. The uniform needs to be clean.

Socks – May be black or navy.

THE HAT

Baden.Powell always stressed the importance of a hat. He said that it is the most sacred part of the uniform and must be worn with pride. It could have many uses in scouting but the most sensible one is for protection.

A CUB HAT WAS THEREFORE ADOPTED BY MOST PACKS AND IT MUST HAVE A BRIM 7 CM WIDE.

The navy hat (Chapell Hat) that you can buy from the scout shop is a good and approved design and is therefore recommended by most packs. This hat can be used on outings also.

Baseball caps are not permitted.

UNIFORM INSPECTION: this is to be held at the very start of a meeting. There is a routine or system in the pack to do so. The Sixers and Seconds are briefed and taught on what to inspect in their Sixes. A cub who is not in full uniform is unable to be part of the flag colour party or be the flag bearer.
